Bubble for young people 

We make theatre opportunities accessible for underrepresented communities, and use drama-based approaches to support health and wellbeing goals.

At London Bubble Theatre we use drama to celebrate marginalised communities and advocate for underrepresented voices. Most of our work takes place in non-theatre settings and engages with people who may feel that theatre or the arts sector is not 'for them'.

Participant wellbeing is paramount to our practice.

We use **FORUM THEATRE** techniques inspired by Augusto Boal's 'Theatre of the Oppressed' to help people explore the disempowerment they experience.

CARE is at the centre of our work, and our projects are designed with social and emotional wellbeing in mind, adhering to John Burnham's 'Social Graces' model.

We coordinate the Southwark Creative Health & Wellbeing Partnership (SCHWeP).

Our projects are designed to achieve creative health related outcomes

Our creative practice supports the development of social and emotional skills.

We follow a trauma-informed, SEND aware approach, creating a safe, supportive environment, focusing on using positive relationships as a tool for healing.

Expected Project Outcomes:

- Artistic excellence
- Improved social & emotional wellbeing
- Increased social connection
- Skills for life & work

Our Interventions can be used to support KPIs related to:

- Education, Training & Employment (ETE)
- Mental health & emotional support
- Connecting with wider services in the community
- Out of court disposals

We can also tailor delivery to support children with SEND.

Principles that sit at the core of our practice include:

- Child first
- Co-creation and youth voice
- Trauma-informed practice
- Understanding of neurodivergence
- Appreciation of lived experience
- Addressing societal power imbalances



WAY INTO WORK

**Work-readiness & interview
preparation programme
for 16-18 year olds**

Currently delivered in:

- Youth Justice Services
- Secondary schools



Interactive sessions culminating in a mock interview with a panel

16-18s are guided through a creative process that supports speaking positively about themselves in an interview context. We explore their attitudes to employment and address challenges they face finding work.

We do this by:

- Observing, discussing and giving advice to a character in a similar situation to their own
- Considering the impression we want to make in a work environment
- Helping identify young people's interests, goals and potential next steps
- Developing self-awareness and the ability to speak confidently about themselves
- Addressing body language
- Preparing content for answering interview questions

This project directly supports ETE objectives.

London Bubble projects with Southwark Youth Justice Service were independently evaluated in '[Creating Justice Report 2021](#)'

67% of participants agreed or strongly agreed that **“I am confident talking to others about my career goals & next steps”**

CREATIVE VOICES

**Drama intervention
programme for 11-18 year
olds about the issues and
themes affecting them**

Currently delivered in:

- Youth Justice Services
- Looked After Children's Services
- Secondary Schools



A 5-session drama project culminating in a sharing of the young people's work

Young People are supported to explore the themes and issues affecting their lives in a collaborative way, leading to a performance for an invited audience.

We do this by:

- Exploring the issues and themes most affecting young people in a safe, respectful and fun way
- Sharing ideas and opinions and challenging assumptions
- Developing team-working skills and better self-awareness by working collaboratively
- Telling the story young people want to tell, and sharing it with an invited audience
- Providing an opportunity for young people to be celebrated for their creative achievements which builds self-belief



Themes explored have been:

- Mental Health
- Peer Pressure
- Social Media
- Family Dynamics
- Safety
- Discrimination

A fun, playful, week-long drama project culminating in a sharing of children's work

Children are encouraged to flex their imagination creating characters and stories, working towards a performance for an invited audience.

We use theatre to:

- Celebrate children's imagination and creativity
- Empower children to share their ideas and opinions
- Work collaboratively, developing team-working and social skills and better self-awareness
- Build children's self-confidence and performance skills
- Providing an opportunity for children to be celebrated for their creative achievements

An interactive play and workshop for year 5 students about the risks of gaming and being scammed online. Visiting 20 schools across the London Borough of Croydon.



Playing Safe

Commissioned by Southwark Community Safety Team

An award-winning youth violence intervention for year 6 students Developed in partnership with the Southwark Family Early Help and Youth Justice Service, Metropolitan Police and Surrey Square Primary School.

A series of six short films promoting the councils 'Start For Life' services for children aged 0-2. The films have been used on the council website, social media and in children's centres across the borough.

A series of short films made by pairing professional writers with care leavers, foster carers and social workers in Southwark to create monologues based on their lived experiences. Three-day creative projects with young people aged 10-14 exploring themes around mental wellbeing and personal identity. These projects were commissioned as part of wider 'health and wellbeing activities delivered across the council.



Future Forward

Commissioned by Southwark Youth Justice Service

A creative project for 13-16 year old's who are disengaged from education, including school avoiders, alternative provision attendees and those with SEND, EHCP and SEMH.

Sessions help to boost engagement, re-introduce participants to collaborative working and encourage young people to think of more positive futures for themselves.


